A painting on a photograph that pictures four nuclear power stations, each with green painted emissions coming from the containment buildings. The two left buildings are plugged with painted corks, the waste oozing from the edges. From the haze of the two right buildings emerges the word "radioactive." An actual cork is adhered to the top right edge of the canvas.
